Integrated Water Development Programme: Water, Health Awareness and Sanitation

This year MH has initiated the Integrated Water Development Programmes. Based on popularity of the individualised £100 tube wells / hand pumps, the IWDP ensures

that at least **80 pumps** are allocated to one 'region'. MH then provides at least **two health awareness workers** to that region for a period of six months, to work with

people at grassroots level on health and sanitation issues. We further install at least **20 latrines** in that region and also plant approximately **60 trees** too.

£600: Provides health worker for 6 months.
£120: One latrine.
£100: Complete tube-well with your name plaque.

Fort Munroe Water Dams serve 50,000 people

Balochistan and parts of southern Punjab (Pakistan), have effectively been in the grip of a devastating drought for the last 9 years.

Thousands of families have been forced to migrate to safer areas, but for many there is nowhere to go.

Fort Munroe, South Punjab has suffered tremendously during this dry decade. The only rains this area is blessed with occur twice in February and July. The rest of the summer and winter are dry and difficult.

MH this year completed the challenging project to harness what little water there is, by building four water reservoirs (dams) that store the water during the dry periods. Each reservoir also includes large purification tanks to filter the water ready for drinking.

Asides from the dams and community schools, pipelines have been laid to pump and transport water from a few springs to the areas of Shaklani and Daropir.

Incredibly this entire project was researched and implemented by MH on behalf of an individual donors through the Muslim Hands 'Its My Project' Scheme. **MHIMP** (see p.10)
